

Tutors getting noticed with every success

RALEIGH – The Give Back Organization is growing and slowly getting the recognition it deserves.

Ronneil Robinson is the founder and executive director of the five-year-old nonprofit organization housed in the Adult Learning Center of Saint Augustine's College on New Bern Avenue. The organization is designed to help students (K-12) obtain the skills to maximize their opportunities for an advanced education.

Tutors help students in difficult subjects by giving them one-on-one instruction during the school year.

Last year, approximately 50 students participated in the after-school program. Robinson said they will serve about 75 students in the fall. The GBO follows the traditional school calendar for Wake County Public Schools.

Robinson said the students are showing steady progress and excelling in school. "Everybody passed the (end-of-grade) the first time," he said.

During the summer months, Robinson is drafting plans for new endeavors for the organization. He has been networking and collaborating with new partners as the organization attempts to expand services.

Robinson hopes to add a few programs under the GBO umbrella. First, he wants to start a group for women called Women Innovation
